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## National Credit Administration Annual Privacy Act Report - 1986

## 1. Call Detail Guidance:

The NCUA is in the process of considering the adoption of a long distance telephone call detail system of records as described in the OPM guidelines, 52 Fed. Reg. 12990, 4/20/87. Enclosed is a memorandum that was forwarded to all NCUA employees working in the Central and Regional Offices concerning personal use of NCUA telephones.

Questions a. through f. as found in OMB's May 11, 1987, memorandum and NCUA's answers thereto follow:

a. Q. When was the last time your agency published a

complete update of its systems notices? Would it be useful to have a requirement for a government-wide update on a regular basis, e.g., every five years?

- A. The last published complete update of NCUA's systems notices was in December 1981, See 46 Fed. Reg. 63141, 12/30/81. A regular government-wide update of systems notices would be useful to the Agency. The NCUA is in the process of determining an appropriate time period, to maximize the benefits of such an update.
- b. Q. Does your agency maintain any government-wide systems of records? Identify each by name and identification number (if any). When was the last time your agency published an update of its government-wide notices?

- c. Q. Your Agency should have reviewed the routine uses associated with each of its record systems during the past year. Discuss results and any actions taken.
  - A. The National Credit Union Administration is planning to review all of its systems of records and the Agency recordkeeping and disposal policies and practices, within a year in order to update and assure compliance with the Privacy Act [5 U.S.C. §552a]. The NCUA will be examining closely the routine use disclosures associated with each system of records in order to ensure that the recipient's use of such records continues to be compatible with the purpose for which the disclosing agency originally collected the data. A determination will be made as to whether any new systems should be added or current systems modified.
- d. Q. For any Matching Programs your agency conducted and reported to OMB during CY 1985, briefly describe any

activities you took to follow-up any hits these programs produced. List numbers of hits produced; dollar amounts identified; actions to verify amounts identified; any recoveries made.

- A. The NCUA was not involved in any Matching Program in 1986.
- e. Q. What is the role of the agency Privacy Act officer in the operation of agency matching programs?
