Dear Ms. Menes:

You have asked whether the charter of the F.R.B. Federal Credit Union permits membership for the sponsor, the Federal Reserve Board of Governors. The charter provides as follows:

The field of membership shall be limited to those having the following common bond: Members, officers, and employees of the Federal Reserve Board, and employees of the Federal Reserve Banks permanently stationed in Washington, D.C.; employees of this credit union; persons retired by the Federal Government as annuitants from the above employment or service; members of their immediate families; and organizations of such persons.

The field of membership, as currently defined, does not permit the Federal Reserve Board itself to become a member of the credit union. To become a member, the Federal Reserve Board would have to be added to the credit union's field of membership. We suggest you contact the Region II Office (tel. 202-682-1900) for advice on how to accomplish this.
