Dear Ms. Coulson:

You have asked whether a family member of a person sharing the basic occupational, associational or community affinity to the field of membership (common bond), may join the fed-eral credit union (FCU) even if the person sharing the common bond does not join the FCV. In general, as long as immediate family members are included within the field of membership, such a membership is permissible. (See Chartering and Field of Membership Manual p. 1-4.) The only exception to this policy, not applicable here, is for student credit unions.
